UPF and FFWPU Thailand: Make Every Day a Family Day seminar

She also shared a brief video clip about her department's work with women and families.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Suriyadew Tripathi, Director of Morality Promotion (a public organization), stated that the family institution is the starting point of development, stability and sustainability of human resources and showed a video clip of the Positive Family Project of Morality Promotion.



Dr. Lek Thaveetermsakul, President of the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (Thailand) said, "The family is the source of love, life, and lineage which is a priceless gift given by heaven and inherited through the family." Participants then watched a brief report and testimonies about the FFWPU project "Thai Families Know, Love, Unite" followed by a Q and A session.

19 distinguished persons were awarded as UPF-Thailand Ambassadors for Peace for their dedicated work to support public welfare in society and the work of UPF and the Family Federation in various provinces of Thailand.
