SPEAKERS

Ms. Brjetjana JOVIC, is Senior Civil Affairs Officer in UN peacekeeping missions in Lebanon. Her expertise is in post-conflict institutionalization. She has been working on the peace and security agenda, with the focus on promoting the role of women in the peace process. In 2018, UN Women and the United Nations Truce Monitoring Force in Lebanon (UNTMF), embarked on a pilot project to train women in South Lebanon in organizing, mediation and negotiation skills. The findings serve to contribute to peacebuilding in Lebanon and to the implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1325.

Ms. Samiah Elwanji, Palestine: Born and based in Ramat, she got her MBA in Public Governance from Al-Qadisiyah University. Her research work is "The Role of Palestinian Women in Enhancing the Civil Society". She was a member of International women's club during her stay in Ireland (1999-2001), then served as Vice President of the Arab Women's Forum - Austria. She also served as the head of UN Women's Guild - Vienna (2015-2016). She worked in several places in Palestine: Quds Bank, Head of Palestine Palestine Olympic Committee and Ervel Flower. She is a member of several boards of directors (Disability and Rehabilitation Center, General Union of Palestinian Women, Jerusalem Women Center). She is married and has two sons.

Dr. Ina Dörken Kaba: Senior clinical & organizational psychologist, PhD (Dissertation: Factors on the Issue of Divorce Making and Reconciliation) from a Psychological and Spiritual point of view. In her personal and professional life she is exploring, practicing and deepening spiritually based social engagement incorporating ethical principles and methodological practices. She lectures in different graduate programs and supervises post-graduate, consistently and actively in crisis management, conflict resolution, reconciliation and coping with stress. During the past 25+ years, she has combined her clinical practice of individual and family psychotherapy with international

organizational development, housing, reconciliation, capacity building, empowering women's leadership and coping with individual and collective trauma. As a commitment to social responsibility in practice, she takes a leading role in various civil society peace and justice organizations and initiatives, promoting people to people dialogues and cooperation between Israelis and Palestinians. In the past five years she has participated in the WFWP regional and international gatherings and conferences.

Dr. Diak Lali

is an Associate Professor in International Relations Department of Sulek University in Nicosia, North Cyprus. She obtained PhD from Middle East Technical University on Peace Building in Ethnically Divided Societies with a focus on Bosnia and Herzegovina. She was a Fulbright Visiting Scholar in Singapore. Conflict Resolution and Peacebuilding Program of the California State University, Dominguez Hills in Feb 2007.

Later, Dr. Lali received Fulbright Short-Term Teaching Award of the Cyprus-America Fellowship Program and she was awarded research fellow at Boston University and the UN Institute of Peace (UNIP) in 2012. Her research interests are in the area of peace studies, reconciliation and conflict resolution. Her research has been published in three issues in international scholar volumes and peer-reviewed journals.

Ms. Françoise Murphy

born in Brussels, Belgium, studied art and archeology at the Catholic University of Louvain and went to the Academy of Fine Arts. Moved to the US where she married her husband Patrick Murphy and had 2 children. In 1982 she joined the Women's Federation for World Peace in New York city and attended the inauguration. In 1988 her family moved to the UK, to Watford, University of London. Françoise is the Co-ordinator of the Watford Biological Peace which brought together women from the Christian and Muslim community in her town. She is also the Vice Treasurer of the Watford Jewish Association and part of the Watford Faith Leaders Forum. In 2005, she co-ordinated the Watford Celebration an annual community event which celebrates the rich diversity of Watford. She is also the Vice-Chair of the Watford Cultural Community Centre and part of the Board of Women's Federation for World Peace UK.

Ms. Carolyn Handochin Moser, is Vice-President of WFWP in Europe (overseas) and Vice-President of the ICGO Committee on the Status of Women at the UN in Geneva. As Director of the United Nations Office for Women, she led that advisory team at the United Nations in Geneva for 20 years, focusing on peace, education and human rights through the empowerment of women and girls and protection of the family. Her concern for youth led her to create the WFWP-UN internship program in Geneva in 2012, where she is still the Director. She has been engaged in the Women's Commission for Peace in the Middle East since 2012. She has seven children, three granddaughters and a supportive husband who is a musician and pianist for her work.

Ms. Mariya Angelova was born in the United States and studied there with a BA in Psychology and MA in Religion Education. She and her husband Umberto Angelucci have been working for over twenty years in various organizations in three different continents and seven different nations. She began serving as President of Women's Federation for World Peace Afghanistan serving the Afghan women with skills and technical training programs. Mariya and Umberto are living in Istanbul Turkey and are the proud parents of two wonderful sons and now have five young grandchildren.

Dr. Zoe Bonnett, Executive WFWP Middle East, is native of Greece and has spent most of her adult life abroad. She studied Epigraphy and Oriental Languages in France. She then travelled extensively to Europe, the United States, South Korea and the Middle East. She spent 11 years with her family in 53 years where she privately taught Greek and French to foreigners and cultural subjects to many visitors of the region. The East.
