THE PHILOSOPHICAL ABSOLUTE

(Overview) January 10, 2017

"The Philosophical Absolute" states that the terms Good and Evil are inconsistent philosophical references due to the inconsistent value systems of religions, cultures, laws, and personal prejudices. The "Just is" ("Just am") state is the consistent philosophical reference; not aligned with that means being in "Philosophical Hypocrisy" and having "Hypocritical Nature".

PHILOSOPHICAL HYPOCRISY

If an individual is not aware of, is in denial of, or is not in understanding of "The Philosophical Absolute" then that individual, according to "The Philosophical Absolute", is in a state of "Philosophical Hypocrisy"; therefore that individual has and personifies "Hypocritical Nature".

HYPOCRITICAL NATURE

"Hypocritical Nature" is the nature of freewill that is not aware of, is in denial of, or is not in understanding of "The Philosophical Absolute".

"Hypocritical Nature" can be divided into two types, "Good Hypocritical Nature" and "Evil Hypocritical Nature".

Evil Hypocritical Nature

Primarily, "Evil Hypocritical Nature" is "Ill Will" towards "Genuine Nature".

"Evil Hypocritical Nature" can take on various forms:

Chauvinism, hubris, derision, incitement, and thuggery towards "Genuine Nature" have been some examples tending towards male type "Evil Hypocritical Nature".

Spite, malicious gossip, deceit, manipulation, as well as snide and sneer towards "Genuine Nature" have been some examples tending towards female type "Evil Hypocritical Nature".

Good Hypocritical Nature

"Good Hypocritical Nature" is nature of good will towards another or others. "Good Hypocritical Nature" is generally kind, virtuous, and righteous, and aspires towards "Living for the sake of others". However, "Good Hypocritical Nature" tends towards "Evil Hypocritical Nature" ("Ill Will") when it condescends or judges "Genuine Nature" from a "Hypocritical Natured" viewpoint. In other words, in some form or another, "Good Hypocritical Nature" will have a tendency to betray "Genuine Nature".

When two or more individuals (Group) of "Hypocritical Nature" have "Ill Will" towards "Genuine Nature", it is termed "The Multiplication of Ill Will towards Genuine Nature".

When any individual of "Hypocritical Nature" demonstrates consistent genuine "Good Will" towards "Genuine Nature", it is termed "The Nature of Good Will towards Genuine Nature".

"The Nature of Good Will towards Genuine Nature" would not, in any way, betray "Genuine Nature".

"The Nature of Good Will towards Genuine Nature" is an aspect of removing "Hypocritical Nature" for Hypocritically Natured male or female.

GENUINE NATURE (Unconditional Nature towards Genuine Nature)

"Genuine Nature" is the nature of the "Just is" philosophy—"The Philosophical Absolute and Genuine Nature"; any incarnate male individual who personifies the "Just is" philosophy has the nature and quality of "Genuine Nature". "Unconditional Nature towards Genuine Nature" is incarnate female nature understanding and abiding "Genuine Nature".

"Genuine Nature" can be divided into two types, "Pragmatic Genuine Nature" and "Natural Genuine Nature".

Natural Genuine Nature

"Natural Genuine Nature" is unlimited imagination and unlimited desire, and its actualization (unlimited beingness of "Genuine Nature").

Pragmatic Genuine Nature

"Pragmatic Genuine Nature" is the limitation of "Genuine Nature" for functional living within the "Hypocritically Natured environment".

CLOSING ARGUMENT

The Divine Principle has its Parallels of History and events; "The Philosophical Absolute and Genuine Nature" has its Synchronicity Curve and Correlations, both concepts deriving the same numbers from the Old Testament Bible, and therefore both concepts intertwined. Just as the Parallels of History could not be derived without the Bible and Christian History, so too, the Correlations could not be derived without the Divine Principle's insights. In other words, the newer concept could only have existed standing on the shoulders of the old one; then, it is very reasonable to conclude, that the old should give way to the new . . . That the Divine Principle give way to "The Philosophical Absolute and Genuine Nature", at an individual level.
