

FFWPU Zimbabwe's Africa Pure Water Wave Cheon Il Guk Youth Workshop

We organized a 3-day educational program for our youth titled "Africa Pure Water Wave: Cheon Il Guk Youth Workshop." This program took place at our Peace Embassy in Harare, both online and onsite, from 21-23 February 2025.

The youths engaged enthusiastically, inspired by words of encouragement from our leaders, including the National Leader of Zimbabwe, Reverend Callisto Mushati.

Through the lectures, participants gained a clear understanding of the significance of the Cheonshim Won providence and the importance of praying in resonance with the spirit world. We began our Hoon Dok Hae at 7 AM Zimbabwean time to create a spiritual atmosphere for the day. Coordinator Tigere Chorumara emphasized the importance of becoming Pure Water.

We joined the Regional Family Service, supported by church members who were delighted to see the youth come together in preparation for the
