UPF La Paz, Bolivia Hosts Peace Road 2024 March for World Peace

The Universal Peace Federation (UPF) Bolivia recently organized its tenth annual "Peace Road" event under the theme "Cultivating Peace and Non-Violence." The peace march, held on October 5, 2024, in La Paz City, brought together approximately 500 participants, including 70 cyclists and 430 pedestrians.

The event saw participation from a diverse group of organizations, including Ambassadors for Peace, the Permanent Association of Human Rights, the Institute of Banking Education, Army Military College, National Police Academy, Confederation of Trade Unions of Bolivia, Interinstitutional Women's Committee, Evangelical Methodist Church in Bolivia, Women's Christian Association, Zebras (Citizenship Education), and the Association of Independent Lawyers.

The closing ceremony featured performances by the Ballet Pasión Boliviana and a dance session for senior citizens, which was enthusiastically enjoyed by all attendees.

Participants reaffirmed their commitment to spreading peace through grassroots activities like the Peace Road, recognizing that love is the humblest yet powerful force available to humanity in consolidating a culture of peace.
