In her opening remarks, she said "Women are created specially to help the world develop, therefore the success of a man depend on us women. We need to portray peace by making God be the center, starting in our marriages through to the communities by loving one another especially through the use of money".

Hon. Dr. (Mrs.) Gladys Ashitey, former Deputy Minister of Health and a Member of Parliament was the Special Guest.

In her speech, she remarked as follows:

"The role of women has not changed in the religious and social organizations, though they differ by culture but all work in the same situation. The contribution of women in the family is huge. They are flexible and unbreakable.


Women are the most valuable co-workers. Women can combine things easily and this makes them unique, e.g., traditionally for child birth, at the public sector very good in health, and in education, we are teachers to change character.



Hon. Dr. Ashitey reiterated that the new economic condition requires new transformation hence learning of languages is very important. She ended by saying that without women nothing goes on, therefore the unity of women makes one strong and healthy. She wished all women well for their good work and advised them to keep it up.

Before the keynote address, a recent video of the founder, Dr. Mrs. Hak Ja Han Moon was shown on how she began in 1992. The gathering marveled on Dr. Mrs. Moon's passion in educating people on how to live the True Womanhood. From the video, they learned how she shared what she had with the poor, sick and also how her husband was very supportive to make one happy big family.





Maputo, Mozambique: A delegation of the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) of Mozambique led by the Chairman of the Peace Council, Rev. Hwa Bum Lee, met with the President of Mozambique, His Excellency Mr Armando Emilio Guebuza from 10:40 AM.

Rev. Lee took the opportunity to explain to the President UPF founder's vision of creating "One Family Under God" as well as the activities in Mozambique since 1996 when he was appointed as missionary to this country.

Also present at the meeting were Mrs Sun-ja Seo, Rev. Lee's wife, Hon. Raul Manuel Domingos, member of Parliament and President of the PDD and Peace Ambassador and Rev. Jean Augustin Ghomsi, Secretary General of UPF Southern Africa. There were also two advisors at the presidency.




Rev. Lee giving a copy of Father Moon's Autobiography to the President

Rev. Lee started thanking the President for accepting to receive him despite his busy schedule and gave him a copy of the autobiography of Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon, As a Peace-loving Global Citizen. "Here you will learn a lot about his vision for national prosperity and world peace," he said.

The Peace Council Chairman summarized the 34 years of Rev. Moon work in America, including his meeting with different American presidents, his speeches at the Congress, and mentioned of his meeting with Gorbachev during his visit to Moscow in April 1990, a "meeting that contributed in ending the Cold War" and his meeting with Kim Il Sung in 1991 to ease the tension between North and South Koreas.

"After hearing you," the President said, "I feel there is hope for world peace now more than ever before. From what I see here, Rev. Moon and his activities are covering everything. We can't speak of world peace while there is poverty. Also when there is no education. I am happy to know that you are taking all these into account. "I admire the vision and I am going to study this speech to learn more. I am going to also read this book (autobiography) in order to understand better. I am impressed by the different meetings with Gorbachev and Kim II Sung." I am also happy to know that many Mozambicans like Hon. Raul Domingos are involved. I know Hon. Domingos as hard working and very keen to do whatever he can for the sake of Mozambique. Also Hon. Abudo and Chitsonzo.

Thanks very much for all you have been doing for Mozambique. Please continue and let's see what we can do together,"he said.
